

Reproduction in Humans

- There are similarities in terms of fertilization in the sexual reproduction of flowering plants and animals.
- In humans, the **ovaries in females produce eggs** and the **testes in males produce sperms**.
- When a sperm fertilizes an egg, a human life is formed.
- The fertilized egg develops in the womb.

More!

The fertilized egg is called an **embryo**.

The embryo develops arms, legs and most of the internal organs at about 3 months (12 weeks) to become a **foetus**.

In humans, the time taken for the foetus to develop into a baby (**gestation**) is about 40 weeks.
